# Reflections from our Pastor

Dear BBC Burleson Family,

I hope this finds you well. We have been walking through the book of Acts on Sunday mornings. This provides us with a bigger picture view of the acts of the Apostles and what happened to spread the gospel after Christ died and arose from the tomb.

We get to see Saul and then Paul in the book of Acts. We also begin to see the importance that he would have on the area and ultimately the world in his actions an obedience in following God's command.

Paul is the writer for a good portion of what we know as the New Testament in the Bible. In all, Paul authored 13 letters, with seven of them directed to churches. (You could get to 14 total for Paul's writings, depending on how you view the book of Hebrews.) Here is one chronological view of Paul's writings:

In each of Paul's letters there is a single primary theme or focus that he gives us. It is simple, yet incredibly important in doing what God has called each of us to do. His teaching firmly points our attention to the teachings of Jesus. Paul was unapologetic in his approach to what would be required from all of God's people when it came to living the lives we had and our participation on the mission we are sent.

In one of Paul's letters to Titus, Paul indicated what kind of character God's people should have. Titus 2:7-8 reads, "in everything. Make yourself an example of good works with integrity and dignity in your teaching. Your message is to be sound beyond reproach, so that the opponent will be ashamed, having nothing bad to say about us."

In this there is a call to stand out in this world. That doesn't mean that we are trying to make ourselves famous, but it does or should change our perspective on how we do all of what we do. Looking at this through the passage in Titus, our output should be an example of Jesus displayed without flaw to everyone we encounter.

It is a high bar to live up to. However, Jesus is the only perfect example that we have in this world. Maybe that changes our perspective, as well as the opportunity in front of us. It is through living out this example that we find our purpose on the mission field we are on. It will change the world!

### Music Notes

#### Hymn Story by Bill Dagle

George Matheson was born March 27, 1842 in Glasgow, Scotland. As a young man, it became apparent that he suffered from partial blindness. By the time, he was 18, he was totally blind. Like his contemporary Fanny Crosby, blind since three months of age, Matheson compensated for lost sight with a very sharp mind and memory. Eventually, he became one of Scotland's outstanding preachers. Like Fanny, he had a photographic mind and would preach his sermons from memory. It was June of 1882, and the Matheson family had gathered in Glasgow for a very special event—the wedding of George's sister. Alone that evening in his study, George was overcome by severe mental suffering. Some speculate that his sister's wedding brought back a painful memory of when George's own fiancé rejected him. She said she could not go through life married to a blind man. Whatever the reason, George was compelled to record his feelings on paper. The end result was the hymn, "O Love that Wilt Not Let Me Go." Matheson said that some inward voice seemed to dictate the lines and that he was quite sure the whole work was completed in five minutes. The Bible ways that death, nor life, or angels, nor principalities, nor power, nor things to come, nor height, nor death, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:38-39) Is there anything separating you from the love of God? If so, ask for forgiveness, repent, and allow Christ to establish a love that will never end—a love not founded on feelings, but on facts.

O Love that wilt no let me go, I rest my weary soul in thee; I give thee back the life I owe, That in thine ocean depths its flow May richer, fuller be.

O Light that follows all my way, I yield my flickering torch to thee; My heart restores its borrowed ray, That in thy sunshine's glow its day May brighter, fairer be.

O Joy that seekest me through pain, I cannot close my heart to thee; I trace the rainbow thro' the rain, And feel the promise is not vain That morn shall tearless be.

O Cross that liftest up my head, I dare not ask to hide from thee; I lay in dust life's glory dead, And from the ground there blossoms red Life that shall endless be. The hymn of the month for March: O Love That Wilt Not Let Me Go.
