Reflections from our Pastor

Dear BBC Burleson Family,

Here we are in April already. It seems like Christmas was just yesterday, and it's coming around again pretty quick. We will run into the Summer and skip into the Fall, only to find Winter again. I know that I used to think I would never grow up or be older to get to do what looked like everyone else could do. Now, looking back at the clock as it continues to spin, there is no way to slow it down.

That got me to thinking about the mission we are on. Jesus presented the disciples with the plan for sharing the good news of the Messiah. The account is found in the book of Matthew. Specifically, chapter 28:16-20. Look with me at it: Matthew 28:16-20 reads, "¹⁶ Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, to the mountain which Jesus had appointed for them. ¹⁷ When they saw Him, they worshiped Him; but some doubted. ¹⁸ And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, *even* to the end of the age." Amen."

Something that is interesting to me is the similarities of the disciples and us, even in today's world. The account that is recorded here is after the resurrection of Jesus from the grave. The disciples are going to gather at the mountain to see Jesus and His resurrected body. If you remember, Jesus taught the disciples about the Kingdom that He would set up. He also said that it would not be a worldly Kingdom. Obviously, the disciples were still confused.

In verse 17, there is a word used here that seems to trip people up. It is the word doubted. For you and I, we might read that (without study) and decide that they didn't believe. The Greek word for doubt is distazo, at least that is how it is pronounced. It means to waiver or hesitate. The disciples didn't have any doubt in who Jesus is, what His mission is, or anything like that. They were hesitant in the identity of the person showing up on the mountain as Jesus. Maybe the best way to look at it is like they were skeptical. Again, they knew Jesus, they followed Him, and understood His message. Even with that knowledge, they still hesitated.

Do you also find yourself in that place from time to time? If you want to see more similarities to the disciples, most of you have had an opportunity to read the Bible. It is God's love story to us, but also an account of what Jesus did for humanity, and more individually; you. You know that the Bible includes some 8810 promises in it, most of which is God's promise to each of us. We might even find peace, and hopefully hope in each of these. And then, when life's circumstances seem to catch up with us all at one time, we begin to think that God might not have our best interest in mind.

The hard part with this is that we know God absolutely has our best interest at heart. And, even through the trial, God is walking with us and will deliver us from harm. We know that, but we find ourselves hesitating to completely embrace our faith and move forward. Look, I know that we can talk a big game, but faith is only built on the battlefield of life. God's desire is to bless us. Make no mistake about that, it is to bless us. Are you willing to trust Him? Even through the trial!

Music Notes

Hymn story by Bill Dagle

The title of this song is "In the Garden" and was wi by C. Austin Miles in a most unlikely place. Miles was an editor and manager of music publishing firms in Philadelphia and Winona Lake, Indiana (headquarters for Billy Sunday). Along with his editorial duties, Miles had developed an interest in photography to the extent of even building his own darkroom. It would be in the darkroom in March of 1912, just before Easter, that the Lord met with this photographer and gave him the words of this hymn in a very unusual way. In his own words, this is how the hymn was born: "One day as I waited for some film to develop, I picked up my Bible which fell open to the Gospel of John, chapter 20. I began to read the story of Jesus and Mary on resurrection morning. As I read it, I seemed to be transported to the actual garden and I became a silent witness to that dramatic moment. I saw the very movements. I heard the very words of Mary as she thought she was talking to the gardener: and I heard Jesus say, 'Mary,' after which I saw her kneel before her Lord and say, 'Rabboni!' Under the inspiration of that holy moment I wrote the poem as it appears today and that evening I added the music." The hymn soon grew in popularity as good friend Homer Rodeheaver used the song over and over again in Billy Sunday meetings across the land and remains today as one of the favorites of Christians round the world:

I come to the garden alone while the dew is still on the roses;

and the voice I hear, falling on my ear, the Son of God discloses.

He speaks, and the sound of His voice is so sweet the birds hush their singing.

And the melody that He gave to me within my heart is ringing.

I'd stay in the garden with Him though the night around me is falling,

but He bids me go; through the voice of woe, His voice to me is calling.

Chorus: And He walks with me, and He talks with me, and He tells me I am His own.

And the joy we share as we tarry there, none other has ever known.


