

# Reflections from our Pastor

Dear Bethesda Baptist Church Family,

I hope this note finds you well. We have seen a lot of things that have changed around us. Both in the city of Burleson, and almost every town around us. According to TxDOT, there are many plans to widen highways, provide bypasses, and even develop additional roads to connect a proposed loop that will surround both Dallas and Fort Worth. With the road changes, the primary reason for them is the incredible change in the population. As you can probably notice from just looking around, the age of the population has changed as well. No doubt, we need to respond. Not to the change in age, per say. However you look at it, the mission we are on is to reach the lost and make disciples. If most of those are younger than we are, we need to change how we address and reach them.

At the church, we have seen some changes, but there are more to come. The personnel committee is currently searching for a secretary. Peggy, after forty plus years with the church, is ready to take a reduced work role. The plan is to bring someone in to work with her for six months. Peggy will turn over parts of her duties during that time to ultimately turn them all over. The new person will be able to 1) know where everything is, and 2) adjust the processes to be a little more up to date. This will help us with audits moving forward, as well as some other processes that might be done a little more with a computer. Please pray about this as we would like to have Peggy remain with us at the end of the six-month period of time and work part time to primarily answer phones and work with the shut ins.

Chris has also indicated that his desire is to retire. The committee will begin to search for a new Worship Pastor. To go with that, they will also search for a new pianist. Mary Ann will take a step away from that. From what I hear they are not planning on going anywhere, outside of a vacation, but they would like to just sing in the choir. He has had a nice long career and we have been blessed to have them both serve here for the many years they have been here.

Having so many personnel changes is not the easy way to go, especially when they are all at the same time. When you couple that with all the other things that we need to do to sharpen our focus in reaching the people in our community in the environment we have, it will feel like a lot of change. Before you get upset about things changing, you need to know that these changes are not happening to take anything away from you. We should only change things to help us to be more effective and efficient in doing the mission God has us here for.

Over the next few months (in this newsletter) I would like to provide a few things that might help you understand what changes could be coming, but also provide you some of the things that will not change. I think it will help you understand that that changes we need to make to reach people won't take away from the things that you hold near and dear.

As I close this article, I want to remind you of things that we need to absolutely keep in mind when we do anything at, in, or through the church. They too are fixed and should not change.

- 1. **God deserves our best**. Through anything we do, we should give God our best. This is through all facets of the church and individually.
- 2. We need to focus on church health instead of church growth. When the church is healthy, growth will happen, but growth alone cannot be our goal.
- 3. We do church best when we do it in small groups. We learn, grow and serve most effectively in small groups.
- 4. Worship is about what we do for God, not what the church does for us. Real worship is about God's people giving God glory through sacrifices of praise. It is about God, not us.
- 5. The local church should have a positive impact on its community. The church should be actively involved in the community and should work to make its community a better place for all its neighbors.

# Music Notes

Hello Church,

It has been a rough month in and out of hospitals and a rehab facility.



I had surgery on my aortic arch on March 26<sup>th</sup> with a team of 4 surgeons working on repairing a 5.5 aneurysm. The surgeon said blood clots were "quivering" in the aneurysm ready to break off. However, the surgery went well.

After four days in ICU and something they called ICU delirium, and two days in hospital, I was sent home, but without Plavix to thin my blood after this surgery. This led me to have multiple strokes in both sides of my brain. This resulted in six more days in the hospital and eleven days in rehab. I am now home and doing well. My biggest symptom is weakness in the legs. I am still using a walker but plan to start Outpatient PT soon to strengthen my legs and endurance. I thank you for all your cards, texts and phone calls, and especially your prayers on my behalf. Bethesda is the most wonderful church family.

I am blessed beyond measure for His care for me. 1 Peter 5:7 in the Amplified Bible says, "Casting all your cares (all your anxieties, all your worries, and all your concerns once and for all) on Him, for He cares about you (with deepest affection, and watches over you very carefully). This verse calms our spirits because we have a great God who hears and knows what is best in our lives. We can trust Him because He is trustworthy. Psalm 7:17 says, I will praise the Lord according to His righteousness, and will sing praise to the name of the Lord Most High.
